Wooden Sample of Horseshoe	89.516	September 12, 1890	Ebenezer B. Rose of Goshen, New York, was a blacksmith who received a patent from the U.S. government on September 12, 1890 covering an improved horseshoe. This is a wooden sample.	Appendix Item A516
Famed Stud Fee for Hambletonian	89.538	June 26, 1861	This is a stud fee that shows Leonard Hudson paid a sum of \$35 to William M. Rysdyk for the services of Hambletonian.	N/A
Individual Teapot for Japanese Tea Party at Historic Track	89.564	1910	This is one of the individual teapot given to each guest at a Japanese tea party at Historic Track held in the summer of 1910. The event was catered by VanTynes of New York City.	Appendix Item A564
